## Sustainability and Sustainable Finance Training For Financial Institutions and Civil Society Organizations

Corporate sustainability and sustainable finance provide two perspectives of the same challenge of how the private sector can be more engaged as drivers of change and action toward a healthier and more prosperous planet for all. This requires companies of all sizes and from different sectors to rethink how they do business not just in terms of economic contribution but also in their environmental, social, and governance (ESG) footprints.

However, this is not easy as reducing impacts and improving on ESG performance require internal capacities and resources to implement. Micro, small, and medium enterprises still need to understand the value of integrating sustainability in their business operations. Furthermore, mobilizing resources for these sustainability initiatives requires financial institutions to be ready to finance these as business investments.

The objectives of this training and workshop are to:

- (1) assist financial institutions implement sustainable finance; and
- (2) promote understanding of sustainable finance among civil society organizations.

The program shall enable its participants to learn how to integrate environmental and social risk factors in risk assessment. The program is designed to be a participative and practical training experience to equip the participants with the skills on how to integrate environmental, social, and governance considerations in the operations of their organizations.

She has a doctorate in business administration from the Ateneo de Davao University, a master's degree in management from the University of the Philippines Mindanao and a bachelor's degree in environmental science from the Ateneo de Manila University.
