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OVERVIEW

How do you execute a transformation process that can sustainably result in long-lasting impact? How do you effectively communicate your strategies for transformation and mobilize stakeholders to co-create change? Using AlM's Bridging Leadership approach, the Leadership and Management of Change is a one-week course aimed at capacitating government and non-profit leaders who take on the unique challenges of public service, along with the political decisions for high-stakes outcomes that have real consequences for communities and public organizations.

PROGRAM OBJECTIVES

Participants in the program are expected:

- To achieve an in-depth understanding of the dimensions of political leadership and power in designing and implementing development initiatives
- To enhance skills and capabilities in developing strategies for managing and leading governance mechanisms on public value, accountability, transparency, and inclusive representation; and
- To develop collaborative platforms to demonstrate transformation processes in local governance.

- Making sense of the complexity of political leadership
- Making sense of current reality and our desired future
- Understand the Bridging Leadership framework as an ethos and tool for leading and managing change
- Co-creating public value
- Understanding complex issues of the political environment and public service through systems thinking

- Creating, sustaining, and designing change projects and programs

Manuel J. De Vera is an Assistant Professor at the Asian Institute of Management (AIM) where his teaching and research focuses on public management, leadership, and negotiations and conflict management. He has also designed and delivered capacity-building programs for the private and public sectors in Vietnam, Timor Leste, Myanmar, Philippines, India and Lao PDR. He is also the Executive Director of the AIM TeaM Energy Center for Bridging Leadership where he leads extensive research work on stakeholder engagement and change management, particularly in the conflict-affected areas of the Philippines. Professor De Vera served as Chief of Staff in the House of Representatives and as Undersecretary-designate in the Office of the Presidential Chief of Staff.

Professor De Vera has a PhD in Development Studies from the Institute of Development Studies (IDS) at the University of Sussex (UK), and a Masters in Public Administration from the Harvard Kennedy School, Harvard University. He has a BA in Political Science from the University of the Philippines-Diliman.
